Who are we?

Ramón Rey Ardid Foundation (FRRA) is a non-profit organization that was created in 1991 to attend the need of people affected by mental illness. In these **20 years of experience** our organization has grown and increased its social presence, working with other collectives (older people, migrants, young people in difficulty, etc.). The common denominator is vulnerability and social exclusion. It works for social and labour integration of groups at risk of exclusion developing different actions: training, awareness, leisure activities, etc.

In order to attain the above mentioned goals, FRRA has established diverse agreements with official bodies and private institutions to develop assistance, prevention, rehabilitation, socio-professional integration and training activities.

Ramón Rey Ardid Foundation is an organization who develops activities for the attention, care and integration of excluded persons or at risk of social exclusion. People are the core of the our activities.

OUR VISSION

A unique value is shared within the Foundation: the ethics and social responsibility of all our activities. It incorporates, in the decision making, values like the ethics, the transparency and the responsibility.

- **The Foundation's activities are focused on people.** The **commitment**, the **transparency** and the **rigor** are essential values of the Foundation's employees.
- **The Foundation collaborates**, as far as possible, with a **sustainable development**, and the **environmental protection**.
- The Foundation **fight against the poverty and social inequality**.
- The Foundation **stimulates** the social dialogue to solve community problems through the participation in different opinion forums.



Some key features

At this very moment, in Ramón Rey Ardid Foundation (FRRRA) around **670 professionals** are taking care of **more than 5.000 people** per year in the different areas of intervention.

- **Elderly** 355 professionals support 1000 people. FRRRA manages 12 elderly residences and 7 day care centers.
- **Mental Health** 63 professionals support 352 people with severe mental health problems. FRRRA runs 1 Psychiatric Residence, 2 psychosocial rehabilitation centers and 13 assisted apartments.
- **Youth and children at risk of social exclusion** 150 people are supported by 12 professionals.
- **Integration and employment** 56 professionals support 2400 people through the employment agency.
- **Volunteering** 90 volunteers participate in different areas. In 2014 we hosted 2 European volunteers and sent 2 European volunteers (within ESV projects).
- **Training** 18 professionals support 890 people through various programmes.
- **Work Integration Social Enterprises (WISE)** of Rey Ardid 160 people.
- **Central Services** 29 professionals.

Work Integration Social Enterprises (WISE)

Rey Ardid has 3 WISEs (for vulnerable people including disabled people, immigrants, people with mental health problems, youth at risk, ex drugs, users, sex workers...). During the last year, 160 people worked in the following activities:

- Pottery art craft manufactures
- Data recording, documents digitalization
- Stonecutting
- Catering
- Management of 5 petrol stations in collaboration with REPSOLYPF

Caserón Baruca offers 10 accessible apartments available for disabled people and people without disability with the objective that all our visitors feel at home.

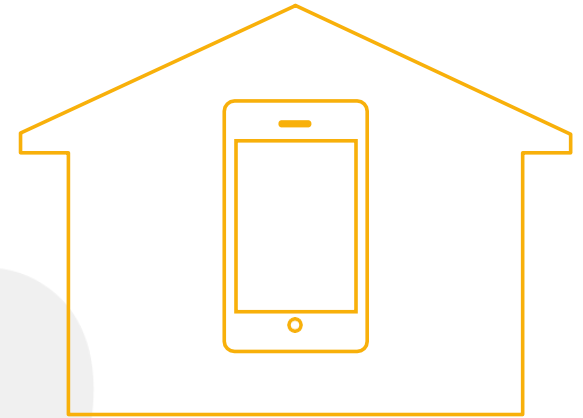
